

# ab116 Beinn Lora from Benderloch

*Benderloch is on the A828 about 7 miles N of Oban*

The walk shown is for guidance only and should not be attempted without suitable maps.

### Short steep walk to superb views

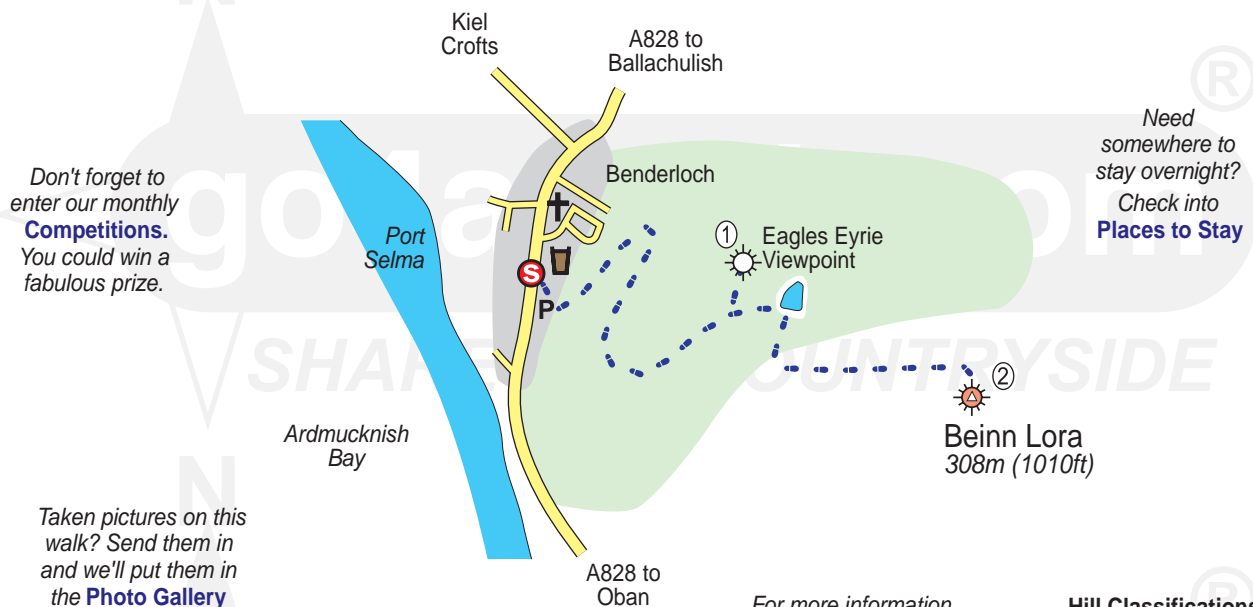
**S** From the small car park in the middle of Benderloch go E through a gate and climb steeply up a well trodden path to the SE (right). The path gains height quickly and almost straight away offers glimpses of the view through the trees. The path passes through a small copse of mature beech trees and continues upwards to reach a fork. Go N (left) following signs for the Eagle's Eyrie viewpoint. This is a dead end path but is well worth the extra effort as it allows a West facing view over Tralee bay with the Island of Lismore behind. Away in the distance is the large granite quarry of Glensanda. (1½ km)

- ① Retrace your steps back to the main path and continue E (left) and the S to reach the deer fence at the boundary of the forest. There is a picnic table here and a chance to get the view south towards Oban, east towards Ben Cruachan and north towards Glencoe. The summit is beyond over a short but often quite boggy path but is well worth the extra effort for those happy with bog-trotting. (1½ km)
- ② Retrace your steps back to the car park and the start. (2½ km)

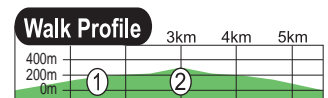
