



# at114 Glenariff Forest Park

Glenariff Forest Park is on the A42 between Ballymena and Cushendall

The walk shown is for guidance only and should not be attempted without suitable maps.

## Forest paths and cascading waterfalls

⑤ From the Glenariff Forest Car Park make your way to the Tea House. Follow a path waymarked with white arrows across the grass slope below the Tea House before turning right up a track. Immediately leave the track and go left through gardens and then descend steps to a shelter. Go S (right) on a track through the forest to reach a bridge over the River Inver. Don't cross but continue S following the river (on your left) upstream past a waterfall to reach another shelter. At a path junction above the shelter go left and follow a meandering path that rounds the head of the valley and crosses three footbridges. (2 km)

① Beyond the 3rd bridge follow a path waymarked with red arrows NE through the trees with fine northerly views before zig-zagging SW (left) down a grassy track. Continue to follow the 'red arrowed' route NE above the River Inver past numerous waterfalls to reach a bridge. (5½ km)

② Cross and continue NE (right) at the path junction beyond. Go right at the next junction to cross a footbridge near the Manor Lodge (restaurant). Go W (left) beside the Glenariff River to the base of a huge waterfall. Follow the red arrows zig-zagging up the cliff before continuing W upstream past more waterfalls. Cross the river at a footbridge to reach the Glenariff Forest Park access road. (1½ km)

③ Cross and follow the 'red route' path that runs parallel to the Glenariff Forest Park access road before leaving it to descend back to the parking area and the start. (1½ km)

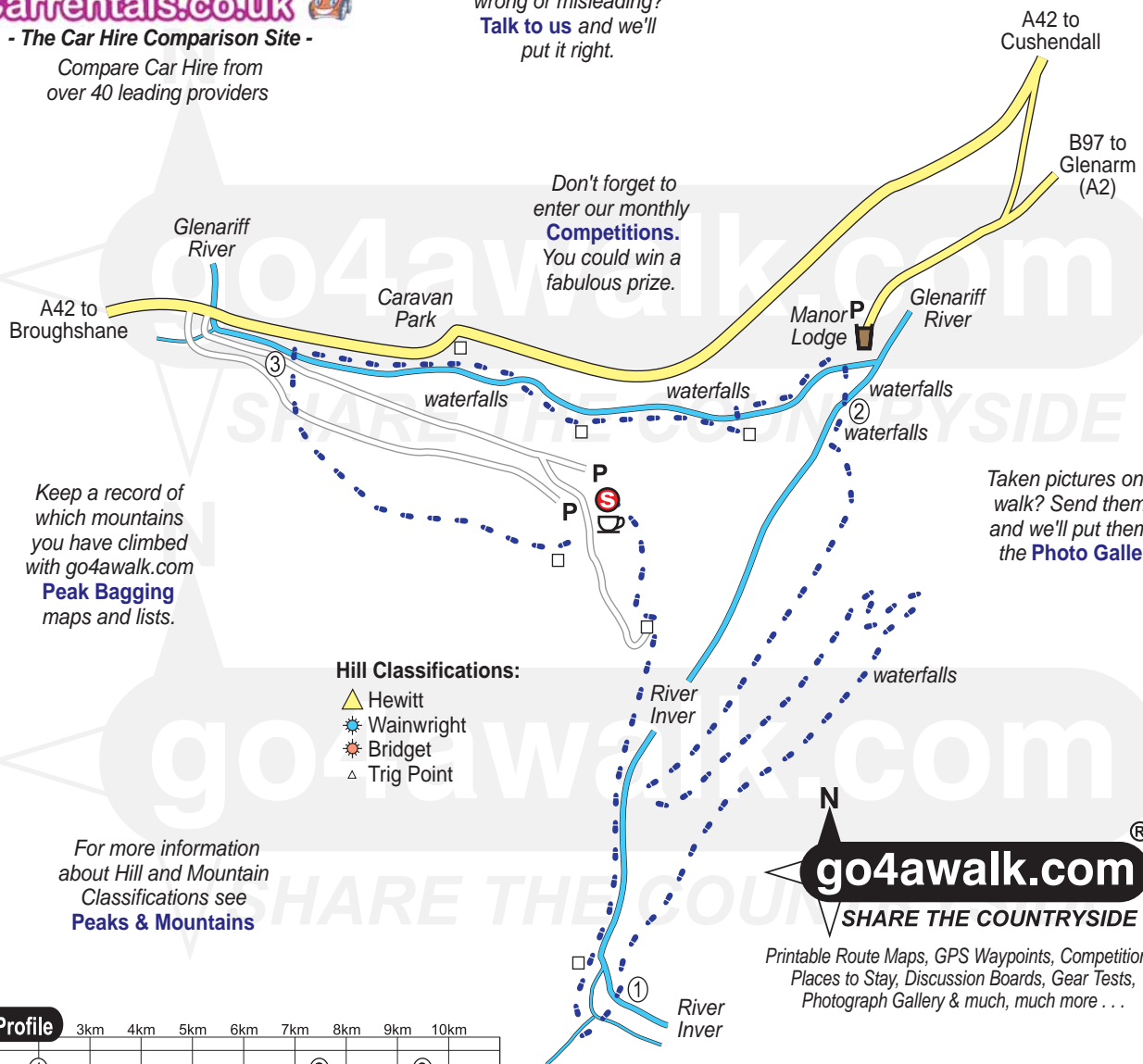
