



d112 Lantern Pike from Hayfield

Hayfield is on the A624
Glossop to Chapel-en-le-Frith Road

The walk shown is for guidance only and should not be attempted without suitable maps.

Total Ascent:	274m (899ft)

A steady climb to superb views

➊ Go W from the car park on the Sett Valley Trail until it bends left to reach a road at a hand gate. Don't go through but go right descending to a 2nd hand gate opposite a Tea Room. Go W (right) on the road over the River Sett. (1¹/₂ km)

➋ Beyond the 1st terrace go NE (right) up a cobbled lane (signed 'Pennine Bridleway Lantern Pike'). Join a concrete track and continue NE (straight on) to reach a road. Go E (right) briefly before continuing NNE (left) up a lane (signed 'Pennine Bridleway Lantern Pike') to reach a gate. Go through and leave the Pennine Bridleway (PBW) and go W (left) up a rocky path. When you reach the ridge go N (right) along the ridge to the summit of Lantern Pike (monument). (1³/₄ km)

➌ From the summit go N and descend to rejoin the PBW. Continue N (left) on the PBW bearing NNW at a faint fork to cross the grass and reach a 6-way junction at a track. (1km)

➍ Go ENE (right) on the track (signed 'Car Meadow' & 'Brookhouses' to skirt round Blackshaw Farm and continue E for 500m. (1/2 km)

➎ Leave the track and go S (right) on a path (signed 'Little Hayfield'). Continue S through Hey Wood and then past some cottages. Keep S (straight-on) at each fork to pass a pond (below you) to reach Swallowhouse Lane. (2 km)

➏ Go ESE (left) into Hayfield and then S (right) on Market St past the village pubs and tearooms. Cross the bridge over the River Sett and then go W (right) between the Bulls Head and the church to reach a pedestrian crossing over the A624. Cross and continue W back to the car park and the start. (3/4 km)
