



ny140 Fremington Edge & Calver Hill from Reeth

Reeth is on the B6270
Kirkby Stephen to Richmond Road

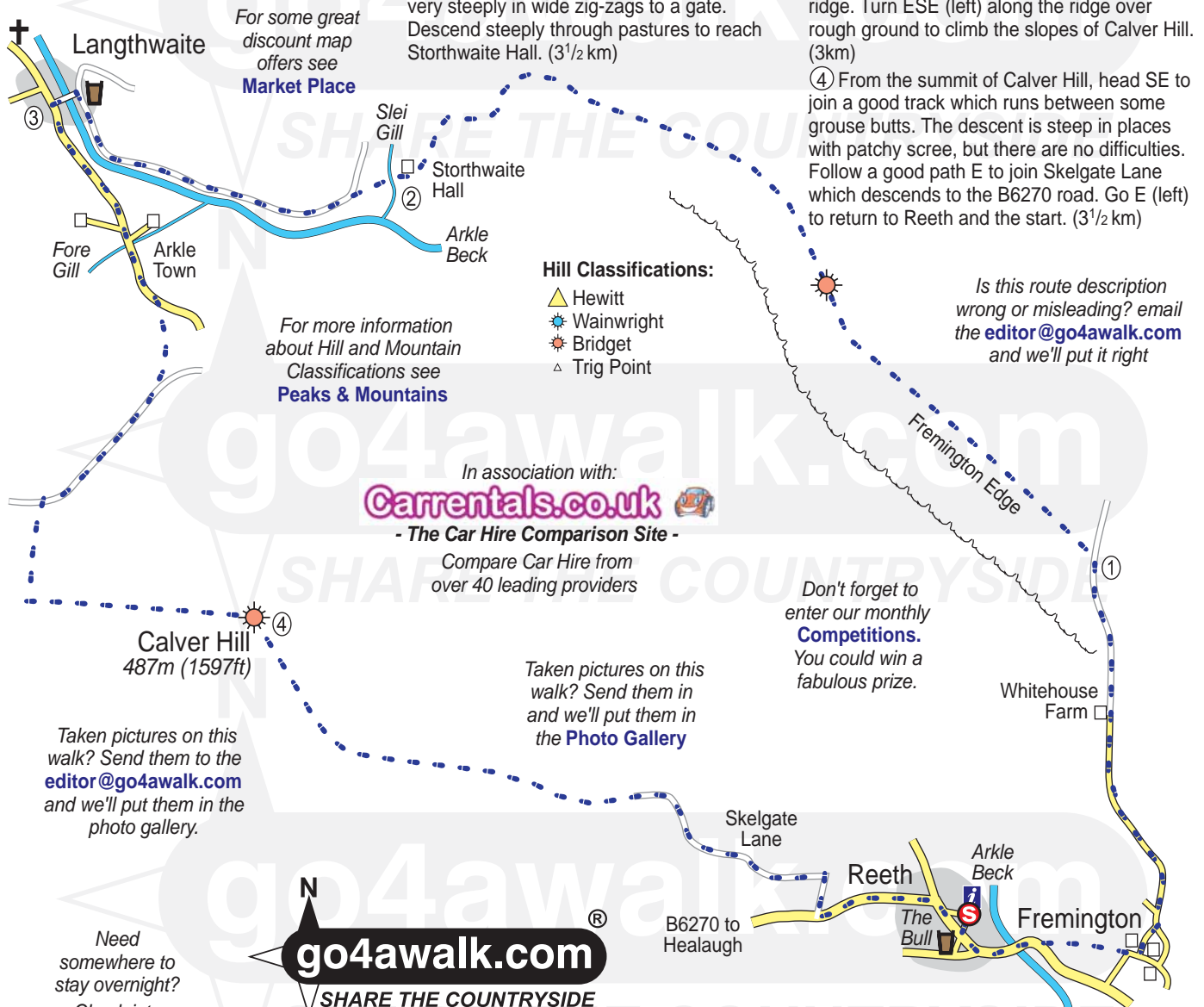
Fine views - though can be wet underfoot

① Go S and then E on the B6270 down the steep hill towards Richmond. Just after crossing Arkle Beck go N through a gate and bear E across pastures to reach a narrow lane. Go N (left) past a junction before going N at the next lane to head uphill & join a steep tarmac road which leads N to White House farm. Continue N past the farm and some old quarries to reach a gate at the very top of the hill. (2½ km)

② Go NW and follow the wall over Fremington Edge Top to join a bridleway which descends through lead mining spoil, gently at first, then very steeply in wide zig-zags to a gate. Descend steeply through pastures to reach Storthwaite Hall. (3½ km)

③ Go SW over Arkle Beck and then SE (right) on to the road back to Reeth. Continue through Arkle Town and a cattle grid before heading S on a bridleway that climbs the hillside. On joining a good track bear SW until the track bends W. Leave the track and go S on a less well defined track to reach the breast of a ridge. Turn ESE (left) along the ridge over rough ground to climb the slopes of Calver Hill. (3km)

④ From the summit of Calver Hill, head SE to join a good track which runs between some grouse butts. The descent is steep in places with patchy scree, but there are no difficulties. Follow a good path E to join Skelgate Lane which descends to the B6270 road. Go E (left) to return to Reeth and the start. (3½ km)
