



# ox144 Dean Bottom from Burford

Burford is just off the A40 Cheltenham to Oxford Road. There is a Free Car Park (with toilets) on Church Road.

The walk shown is for guidance only and should not be attempted without suitable maps.

*Gently rolling scenery*

① Go E from the Tourist Information Centre to reach the High St. Go N and cross the narrow bridge over the River Windrush before bearing NE on the A361 towards Chipping Norton. Just beyond Walnut Row go SE (right) on a waymarked path beside Cotland House. Continue E (left) beyond over stiles to pass behind some gardens and then a field edge before going N (left) over a stile to reach a lane. Follow the lane to rejoin the main road in Fulbrook. (1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> km)

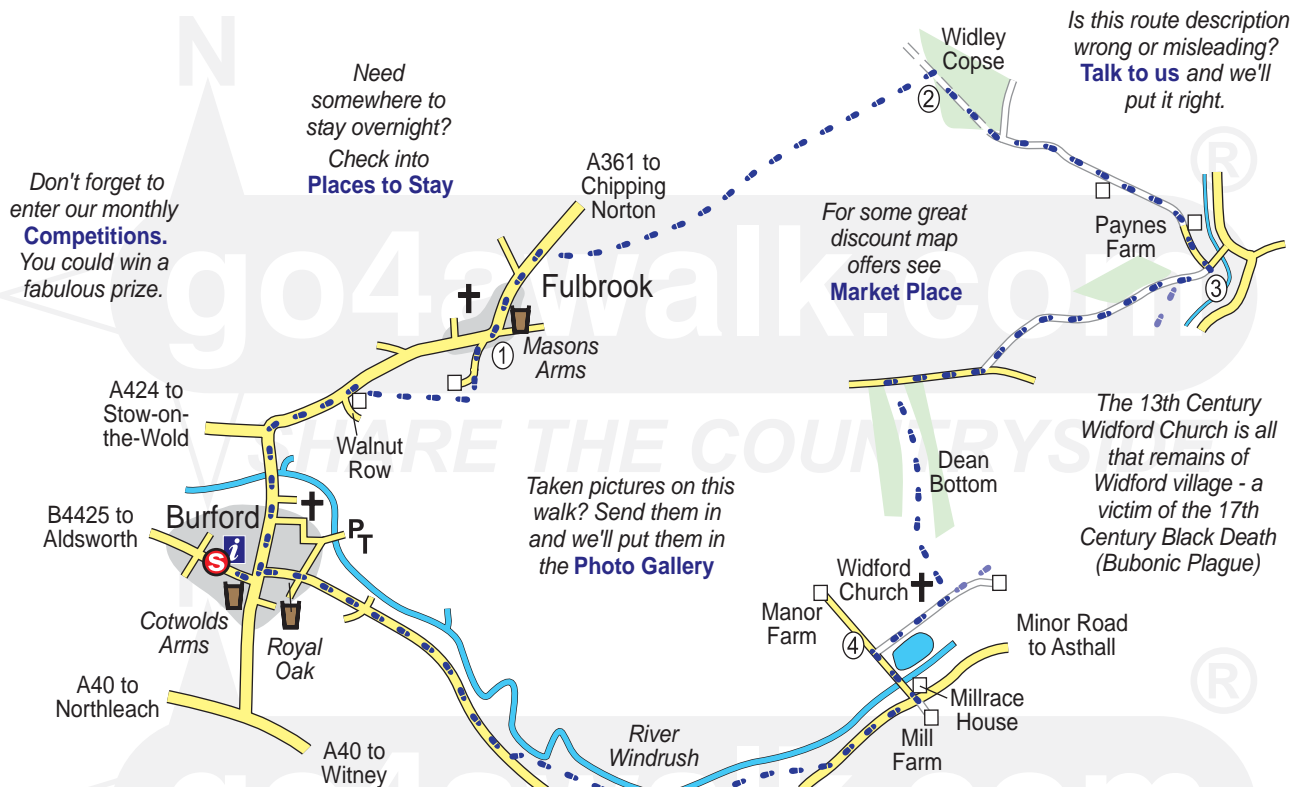
② Go NE (right) on the road for 300m before leaving it to go E (right) on a signed footpath. Follow the path initially along a field edge, and then NE (half-left) across a sloping field to the opposite corner. Go through a gap and continue NE beyond across another field, through a 2nd gap and a 3rd field to reach a track on the edge of Widley Copse. (1<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> km)

③ Go SE (right) on the track through the wood to reach Paynes Farm. Continue beyond the farm to a 'T-junction' of tracks. (1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> km)

④ Go SW (right - signed 'Right of Way') to reach a gate. Go through and continue beyond through a couple of fields to reach a lane. Go W (right) on the lane and descend into a dip. At the bottom go S (left) over a stile (signed 'Widford' & 'Swinbrook') and go S through Dean Bottom. At the other end go SW (right) on a waymarked path over a cattle grid and S of Widford Church before reaching a lane. (2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> km)

⑤ Go SE (left) on the lane to reach a road. Go SW (right) on the road for 200m before leaving the road to follow a path beside the River Windrush. After crossing several stiles, the path rejoins the road. Go NW on the road to return to Burford and the start. (3 km)

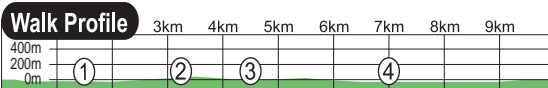
