Surrey's most popular viewpoint

① Go N (left) out of the car park along the road to reach Mickleham church. Continue N on the road to cross the A24 and then a bridge over the River Mole. Continue N on the road beyond to reach a (grass) triangular junction. (2½ km)

② Go W (left) and climb to a fork. Continue W (left) through a wooden barrier to ascend to a signed crossing path. Continue W by trees to reach a path junction at a fence corner (go S (left) for 100m to a fine viewpoint). Continue W beside the fence to reach a side gate to Norbury Park House. Continue NW (left) beside the fence to reach a lane. (1km)

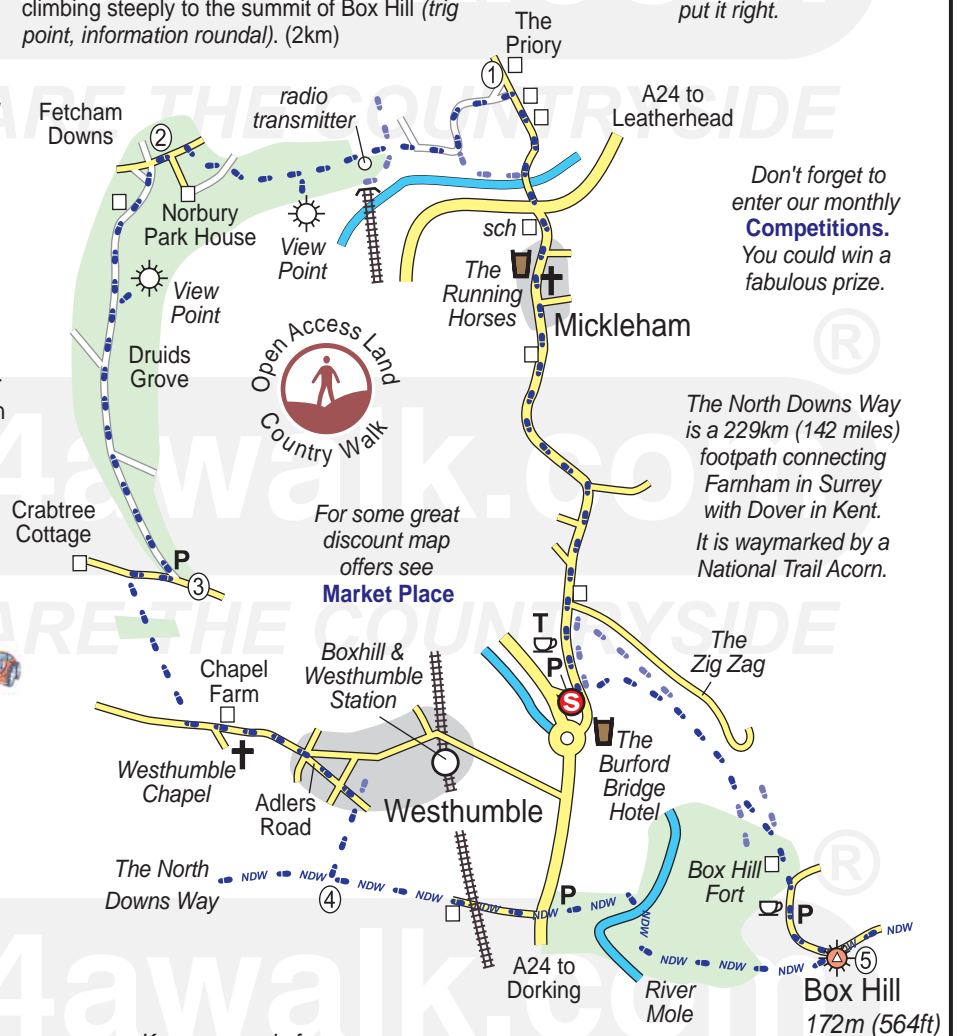
③ Go W (left) on the lane past the main gate to Norbury House to reach a picnic area. Go S (left) through a wooden barrier to follow a clear track through the trees. At a fork go S (right) on a bridleway that bears SE to reach a car park and then a road. (2km)

④ Go W (right) up the road for 200m and then SE on a signed path that descends through a field, a wood and a 2nd field to reach a road. Go E (left) on the road past the remains of Westhumble Chapel to reach a crossroads. Go SE on Adlers Lane and continue SE at a junction. At a crossing path go S (right) on a footpath (signed 'Dorking') to reach a 2nd crossing path - The North Downs Way (NDW). (1½ km)

⑤ Go E (left) on the NDW to pass under the railway and then cross the A24. Go through the car park opposite to reach the River Mole. Cross the river (via the stepping stones or the bridge to the N) and continue E on the NDW climbing steeply to the summit of Box Hill (trig point, information roundal). (2km)

⑥ Go NW (left) across the grass to reach a road and then W (left) on the road to go N pass the car park and NT Shop. At a '1.5T' road sign go NW (left) past Box Hill Fort to descend a bridleway to a fork. Go NW (left) to join a 2nd path that descends across the grass. After 200m fork (W) left on a faint path to descend more steeply. Continue through a small wood to reach a road opposite the car park and the start. (2km)

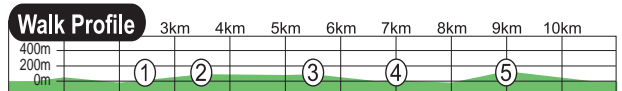
