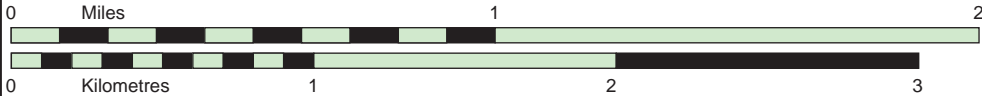


# wi137 Sugar Hill from Aldbourne

Aldboune is SE of Swindon on the B4192 Swindon to Hungerford Road



The walk shown is for guidance only and should not be attempted without suitable maps.

Total Ascent:	266m (872ft)

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A delightful stroll from a typical Wiltshire village

- Ⓢ Go W from the village square and follow the B4192 as it bends NW. After about 1000m (and just after passing a barn) leave the road and go W (left) on a signed brideway. At a fork go NW (right) to follow a clear track signed 'Upper Upham'. Continue NW on the track and then across open fields to reach a lane. (3½ km)
- ① Go SW (left) on the lane and follow it W through Upper Upham to reach Upham Farm. Continue NW through the farm on a brideway beyond to reach a crossing path - 'The Ridgeway'. (2km)
- ② Go N (right) on The Ridgeway bearing NE to reach a fork. Go E (right) and follow a clear track down to reach the B4192. Cross and continue on the track beyond climbing again up Sugar Hill passing through a gateway enroute. (3½ km)
- ③ Just before a band of trees leave The Ridgeway and go SE on a clear brideway to reach Four Barrows. Go through a small gate and then follow an enclosed track that descends to reach a lane. Go S on the lane to return to Aldboune and the start. (4½ km)

The Ridgeway is a 137km (85 mile) footpath linking Overton in Wiltshire with Ivinghoe Beacon in Buckinghamshire. It is waymarked with a National Trail Acorn

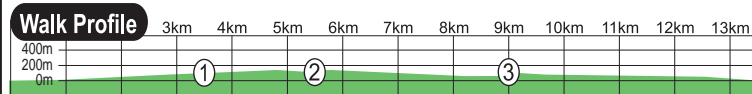
